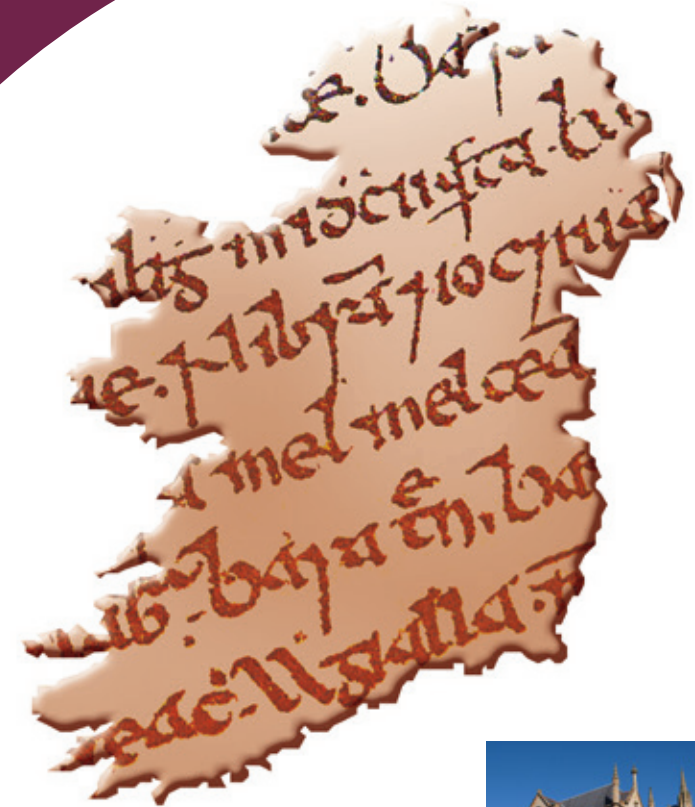

## Overview

Our interdisciplinary programme, the only one of its kind on the island, will enable participants to acquire a specialist knowledge of Irish Studies across drama, film, history, literature, peace and conflict studies and politics. You will also sample the rich cultural heritage of north-west Ireland, while immersing yourself in the Irish language (with one of Western Europe's oldest vernacular literatures) with a week-long residency in the adjacent Donegal Gaeltacht (Irish-speaking region). The curriculum connects the inter-related cultures, histories, languages and literatures of north-west Ulster, Ireland, Britain, Europe and North America.

## Tuition

Our teaching team are graduates of the Universities of Alberta, Calgary, Cambridge, Cork, NUI, Galway, Oxford, Sheffield, Trinity College Dublin, Queen's University Belfast, Ulster and Wales; they have published extensively in their subject areas and presented on radio and television.
