It is a broad charge, to be sure—and in a sense, it is a charge that applies to all our scholarship. We all know that we are now working in a volatile new world of academic reconfiguration. Scholars in all disciplines (and especially in the Humanities) must necessarily understand that they speak in a time of transition.

We invite papers and panel proposals considered about any topic pertinent to Irish or Irish diasporic culture. In keeping with the interdisciplinary remit of Irish Studies, we welcome papers from all disciplines, and especially welcome proposals from disciplines less commonly heard from in Irish Studies, such as art, archaeology, music, politic science, and economics. The Lawrence McBride Lecture will be presented by Dr. Karen Steele of Texas Christian University, whose books include *Maud Gonne's Irish Nationalist Writings* (2004) *Women, Press, and Politics during the Irish Revival* (2007), and with Michael de Nie, *Ireland and the New Journalism* (2014).

The conference poet will be Thomas McCarthy of Cork, author of six collections (the most recent of which is *Pandemonium*, Carcanet, 2016), as well as two novels and an essay collection. He is a member of Aosdána.

The conference will also feature the launch of an anthology of works by all O'Shaughnessy Poetry Award honorees, to be published this autumn by Dedalus Press of Dublin.
