We invite proposals for papers on any topic in Irish Studies, but the conference is particularly interested in papers that explore the concept of resistance in Irish history and culture. The concept is as old as Ireland, and has taken on manifold forms, from the more obvious armed struggles against colonial power to more recent reactions to racism or the global financial and immigration crises. Irish language and literature offer innumerable examples of resistance, with forceful challenges to forces such as linguistic domination, gender formations, political oppression, state censorship, religious control, disciplines of sexualities, economic injustice, literary traditions and forms, and consumerism.

We welcome fully formed panels of 3-4 participants, as well as individual papers.
